State police release statistics for May

FORT WAYNE — The Indiana State Police post in Fort Wayne has released its statistics for May:

- traffic citations issued, 2,659;
 - traffic warnings issued, 3,356;
 - seatbelt violation citations, 120;
 - child restraint violation citations, 1;
 - speeding trucks over 10,000 pounds, 69;
 - criminal arrests, 149; and
 - drunken-driving arrests, 79.
- Detectives from the

Criminal Investigation Division worked 17 new cases and made three criminal arrests.

A total of 142 cases were drawn by troopers and detectives.

Three Fort Wayne district troopers with K-9 partners made 37 searches that yielded 19 arrests, assisted other agencies on 10 occasions, seized 163.7 grams of marijuana and two grams of meth.

The Indiana State Police post in Fort Wayne serves nine northeast Indiana counties: Adams, Allen, DeKalb, Huntington, LaGrange, Noble, Steuben, Wells and Whitley.

Retailers launch push for Sunday alcohol sales

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — A retailers group has started a new push aimed at building public support to allow Sunday carryout alcohol sales in Indiana.

The Alliance of Responsible Alcohol Retailers on Monday announced its new campaign called "Change It Indiana" that

is also seeking to legalize the sale of cold beer by convenience, drug and grocery stores.

It argues that 47 states allow Sunday carryout sales and that Indiana loses about \$9 million a year in tax revenue to alcohol sales in neighboring states.
