This Ordinance serves to Amend and Restate Ordinance 2021-23 for the purpose of reallocating funds in the ARPA Plan (the "Plan") for the purpose of complying with the provisions of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and for the purpose of complying with the allowable uses and timeline for dispensing of said funds in accordance with applicable Federal and State regulations.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2021-23 THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARP/ARPA) SPENDING PLAN AND RESTATEMENT OF THE ARP CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY GRANT FUND (FUND # 176)

WHEREAS, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP or ARPA) provides relief for families, workers, businesses and governments impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency. Through ARPA, Indiana will receive approximately \$1.28 billion for local government entities through the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, or CLFRF; and

WHEREAS, on January 4, 2022, the City of Auburn, Indiana, passed Ordinance 2021-23 entitled “An Ordinance Establishing the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP/ARPA) Spending Plan and Restatement of the ARP Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Grant Fund (Fund #176); and

WHEREAS, the City of Auburn, Indiana to ensure acceptable usage, both the United States Treasury Department and the Indiana State Board of Accounts requires a local fund to be established to set out a “Plan” for spending said funds to promote accountability and transparency; and

WHEREAS, the funds are to be allocated by December 31, 2024, and the period of performance lasts until December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance and/or Plan detail the amended proposed uses of the monies, displayed in a way that complies with the terms and conditions of the APR Act; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2021-23 is hereby amended, as follows, and restated in Exhibit “A”.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDAINED BY THE
COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUBURN, INDIANA, as follows:**

Section 1.

It is hereby restated that the Common Council of City of Auburn, DeKalb County, Indiana, has established the ARP Local Fiscal Recovery Grant Fund (Fund #176) pursuant to Indiana Code 5-11 and Ordinance 2021-05 of the Auburn Common Council and created the ARPA Plan pursuant to Ordinance 2021-23 of the Auburn Common Council.

The sources of the funding for the fund include monies allocated to the City from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA). The monies in this fund shall be used for eligible purposes of the ARPA.

Section 2.

The Clerk-Treasurer, as the fiscal officer of the City of Auburn, and the City Attorney as the legal officer of the City of Auburn, have reviewed the Plan for compliance with the Act.

A detailed accounting of the fund and the spending associated therewith will be kept for future audits.

Section 3.

The City of Auburn has received or will be receiving approximately \$3,044,316.00 in revenue.

The City of Auburn, Indiana, now hereby adopts and implements the following Plan that sets forth the projects / initiatives of the funds to be allocated from the American Rescue Plan Act (APR or ARPA):

**PROJECT 1: UNION STREET STORM WATER SEPARATION AND
WATERMAIN REPLACEMENT**

The City of Auburn, Indiana, in its efforts to comply with the Clean Water Act of 1977 and to continue to upgrade the infrastructure and delivery system of the City water system, will take steps to separate the storm water infrastructure from the sanitary sewer and to perform watermain replacement along Union Street in the City of Auburn, Indiana.

*Estimated Cost: \$1.3 million
Timeline: 2022*

Note: the City has been awarded a CCMG grant to cover one-half (½) the cost of repairing / replacing the street and sidewalks after the infrastructure improvements are completed. The portion associated with the street and sidewalk project is not part of the 1.3 million dollars in expenditures.

PROJECT 2: FULTON STREET UPGRADE

The City of Auburn in its efforts to comply with the Clean Water Act of 1977 and to continue to upgrade the infrastructure and delivery system of the City water system will take steps to separate the storm water infrastructure from the sanitary sewer along Fulton Street in the City of Auburn, Indiana.

PROJECT 3: HELP GRANT

The City of Auburn, Indiana, recognizes the effect of the Coronavirus public health crisis on the citizens of Auburn, the local capacity of Auburn, and the workforce of Auburn. The City of Auburn, Indiana, has applied and received the GRANT from the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs for the Hoosier Enduring Legacy Program.




